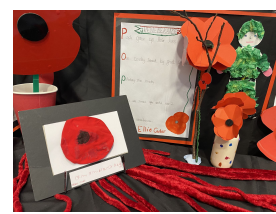
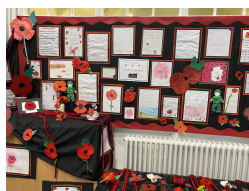


Freeman's Endowed Church of England Junior Academy Newsletter

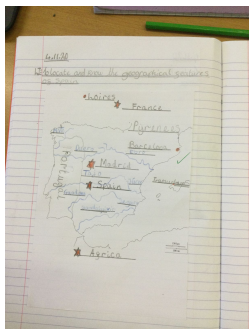
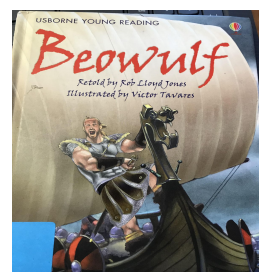
Year 3

Year 4

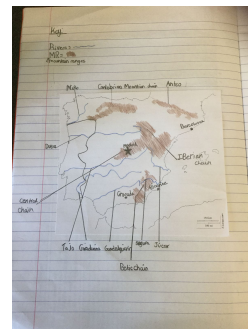

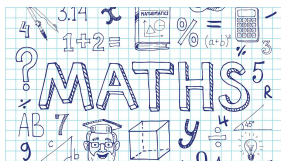
