This Week's Great Work!




Year 3

Year 3 have thoroughly enjoyed their first music lesson this week. They have been introduced to the glockenspiel, focussing on holding the beater correctly and identifying and following the pulse. We finished with a song where we focussed on playing the notes D and E. We began to follow a piece of music, learning what a note and a rest looks like.




Year 4


In science this week, we have been learning about the different states of matter. We have learnt about particles in solids, liquids and gases. We also conducted an experiment to test the question: Does a gas weigh anything? The children weighed different fizzy drinks and then stirred them until all of the bubbles had gone. We then weighed the liquids again to see if there was a difference in their weight. This great piece of Science work was produced by Leanne.



Year 5

This week in English, the children have been learning to use dialogue to enhance descriptive writing. They have been working really hard to ensure they are using all of the correct punctuation. They have been adding descriptive detail and using punctuation for characterisation. Here are some examples from Ella and Maddison practising their use of dialogue.
