
This week our school has made us extremely proud!

#### Health Visitors

They can help with a wide range of concerns such as feeding, minor illness, toilet training, behaviour, postnatal depression and anxiety.

#### Sensory Virtual Workshop

The workshop aims to help parent/carers gain a basic understanding of sensory processing, focusing on areas such as::
