
Zoe M was also awarded an R&D medal for being a superstar at the R&D holiday club.


Great work in Year 4

Religious Education

In RE we have been learning about the story of Noah and the promises he made to God. We then thought about promises that we could make in class to make our classroom a better place to learn. The children wrote one promise that they would make and decorated it with symbols of peace.




Maths - finding perimeter.



Our focus this week is finding and measuring perimeter - the distance around the edge of a 2D shape. This is Addison's work. He was counting the perimeter on a grid. We checked our work by adding the length of each side.

Our challenge was to draw different rectangles with a perimeter of 20cm. Oliver K has demonstrated two different ways here.



Science

We began our topic on States of Matter with role play. The children pretended to be the particles of a gas, a solid and a liquid. They have then recorded their ideas in both diagrams and a written description.

History - A Saxon time traveller!

On Tuesday, the children in Year 4 spent the day learning what everyday life was like in Britain during the 5th and 6th Century. The children were incredibly well behaved and so engaged in all of the activities. We were so proud of their amazing questioning skills, as well as the knowledge

they had retained.







The armour they wore was really heavy, but the children thoroughly enjoyed modelling it, discussing the materials they were made from and their effectiveness for battle.


Film night
