

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about WhatsApp is the wor o billion users exchanging texts,

photos, videos and documents, as well as making voice and video calls. Its end-to-end encryption means messages can only be viewed by the sender and any recipients: not even WhatsApp can read them. Updates to its privacy policy in 2021 (involving sharing data with parent company Facebook) caused millions to leave the app, but t caused millions to leave the app, but the new policy was widely misinterpreted = it only related to WhatsApp's business features, not to personal messages
